Litter Heroes volunteer their time to improve the environment around them. The Litter Heroes programme offers individuals the chance to join a network of likeminded people, empowering them to tackle the problem of litter in their local area.

Our funder target asks us to register an **additional 100 18-24 year old** young people by 2026. This year we **registered 88** - so well on the way to achieving this



Volunteers have registered as official #LitterHeroes during 2024-25. This is a **36%** increase from **23-24**.




We have 218 fantastic Litter Heroes Ambassadors and are well on our way to meet our funder target of 100 more Ambassadors by 2026.

Ambassadors support our mission of community action for the environment. They encourage new volunteers to connect with Keep Britain Tidy and record litter-picking data via Collect & Count. This helps us build a national picture of the scale and impact of litter and volunteer action.

CASE STUDY

Our Litter Heroes Ambassadors go above and beyond to advocate for their local environment and engage their communities in litterpicking. In this case study, we're celebrating Ashton Samuels and El Clarke, the couple behind litterpicking community 'Clean Our Patch'.



Back in 2018, we had noticed the litter problem getting worse in Plymouth. At about the same time, El was having some difficulties at work and they were making her very depressed.

With El's quality of life diminishing, her husband Ash was looking for something that would get her out of the house and suggested litterpicking on the street they live on.

After that first pick, they posted a photo on social media and a friend asked if they could join in.

Within a few weeks, there was a small group going out weekly in Keyham.

And so, the **Clean Our Patch network** was born, and has grown from **strength to strength**!

In the six years since Clean Our Patch was launched, **43 litter-picking collectives** have formed in Plymouth and South Hams, with El and Ash supporting with all the behind-thescenes work.

In their 'patch' they have also engaged **47 schools** and supplied nearly **1,000 sets** of litter-picking kit!

Our Care programmes support community groups who want to protect and enhance their local waterways and beaches.

In East Anglia the RiverCare & BeachCare programme works from source to sea, supporting around 50 local groups from the Humber Estuary to the southern coast of Essex.

Groups are equipped, insured, trained, and supported to litter pick, undertake habitat improvements, remove invasive species, get involved in citizen science, and become spokespeople for the environment in their local communities.

Similarly, the BeachCare Southwest programme supports volunteers to deliver environmental impact across the beautiful beaches of Devon and Cornwall. It offered sustained support for dedicated volunteer groups and encouraged corporate volunteering which fostered a culture of corporate social responsibility.

CASE STUDY

Our Care Group Leaders pave the way in making a tangible difference to their local environment and community. In this case study, we're celebrating Grantham RiverCare, the guardians of a vital 1.8 mile stretch of the River Witham in Lincs. Their true community spirit came into being during the floods in January this year.

began with the initial vision of John Knowles and continues today under the co-leadership of David Martin and lan Simmons. The group is made up of over 65 volunteers who have prevented countless pollutants from entering our precious waterway, making Grantham a healthier and more beautiful place for all.



Despite being on a scheduled break, when floods hit the UK in January 2025, the extraordinary team sprang into action with remarkable speed.

They provided **vital flood alerts** and warnings to residents, established a welcoming hot drinks hub for those affected, and undertook **monumental clean-up efforts** once the waters receded.



By April, an astounding 100 bags of debris and numerous large, cumbersome items were removed. The riverbanks, once a scene of carnage were restored to the beauty of late Spring.


Grantham RiverCare's impact extends far beyond just cleaning. Their #RiverHeroes actively contribute to community resilience in lasting ways. Their detailed observations and invaluable information sharing directly assisted the Environment Agency in finalising their comprehensive flood report.



The <u>Ocean Recovery Project</u> was born from a desire to challenge the status quo of recovered beach plastics heading for landfill, and net and rope from the fishing industry being discarded at sea.

Recycling mixed beach plastics, net and rope is challenging. However, through collaborative work with industry, this project has developed vast experience and knowledge to pilot recycling solutions that benefit communities across the UK. We have helped many groups, organisations, and businesses to recycle recovered beach plastics and create useful products.

The Ocean Recovery Project has been at the forefront of developing new systems that benefit the environment. Over 150 tonnes of fishing trawl net have been collected and recycled through a UK first recycling system. By providing systems and the opportunity to recycle nets at harbours to fishermen we intercept material that could otherwise be left at sea.





Our aim is to empower beach cleaners, increase recycling rates, and develop new techniques for recycling 'hard to recycle' plastics. Importantly, we try to keep the carbon footprint associated with transporting and processing plastics as low as possible.



CASE STUDY

The **Ocean Recovery Project** is a trail blazer in recycling plastic waste found on beaches or in the ocean. In this case study, we're showcasing how collaboration with a local artist has helped to raise awareness of plastic pollution.



Over the 2024 summer season, we collected **907 broken** and **discarded bodyboards** from locations across Devon & Cornwall.

A number of these were donated to Simon Smith from Porthtowan Fine Arts. Simon created a giant sculpture, **'Swells of Discard'** which formed the final piece for his fine arts masters degree. The sculpture will be toured across the South West to spread the message of waste created by conspicuous consumerism.
