

## PLASTIC RECYCLING GUIDE



		PETE (Polyethylene Terephthalate)
PETE	WIDELY RECYCLED	Clear plastic bottles eg, fizzy pop bottles, mouthwash and water bottles, clear plastic jars, some yoghurt pots
HDPE	RECYCLABLE - CHECK	HDPE (High Density Polyethelene) Stiff plastic - often coloured eg, plastic milk bottles, bleach/detergent /shampoo bottles.
Δ		PVC (Polyvinyl Chloride)
PVC	NOT RECYCLABLE	PVC is used for toys, window frames, chairs, doors.
		LDPE (Low Density Polyethylene)
	RECYCLABLE - CHECK	Hard flexible plastic, eg, plastic bags, bread bags, frozen food bags. Plastic bags and bread bags can be recycled through single- stream collections at supermarkets.
$\wedge$		PP (Polypropylene)
PP PP	RECYCLABLE - CHECK	eg, take away tubs, some microwaveable food trays, margarine trays. PP is NOT recyclable through domestic collections but can be reused commercially.
$\wedge$		PS (Polystyrene)
	NOT RECYCLABLE	eg, foamy take away packaging, disposable cutlery, some meat trays, styrofoam, stirrers, some yoghurt pots.
		Other
Other	NOT RECYCLABLE	This categorises all other plastics including bioplastics, composite plastics like crisp wrappers and plastic-coated wrapping paper.
