VIRTUAL MONITORING STREET CLEANSING



Grading to national standards on cleaning streets and green spaces

Course Outline

The look of our streets and open spaces, especially where we live and work, is very important to our quality of life.

Monitoring the levels of cleanliness and adhering to legal requirements, as set out in the Code of Practice on Litter and Refuse (COPLAR), can ensure that standards are being met. This ensures a consistency of grading standards but also identifies opportunities to utilise resources more effectively and efficiently.

This virtual course provides guidance on surveying grading standards, land use types and effectively using the information gained. It can also be adapted to include bespoke elements relevant to your organisation.

Course Aims

Provide delegates with the knowledge and skills to assess, grade and monitor standards of local environmental quality.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of each session delegates will be able to:

- Understand the background to Street
 Cleansing Monitoring and references to 'NI195
- Identify the various land uses and why we need to know
- Determine transect (survey site) dimensions
- Identify the different indicators and define them
- Carry out a survey and assign the correct grade

Who Would Benefit from Attending this Course?

This course is aimed at anyone carrying out local environmental quality monitoring including local authority staff, housing managers, Business Improvement District monitoring officers, or contractors wanting to track the level of service they are providing.

Course Duration

A 3.5 hour virtual session. As this is a virtual session delivered via MS Teams, the practical element has been replaced by a surveying video.
