



Litter from Vehicles Enforcement

Tackling litterlouts who mindlessly throw rubbish from their vehicles can now be dealt with through new powers to impose Fixed Penalty Notices. This is a civil regime as the fine can be levied against the vehicle keeper.

This one-day course will clearly explain all the steps local authorities need to take to implement an effective strategy to carry out this important enforcement activity, as part of a broader approach in the plight to keeping our communities litter free.

When litter is thrown from a vehicle it can be difficult to identify the offender. Legislation to tackle litterlouts and those who mindlessly throw rubbish from their vehicles enables local authorities to issue a penalty charge notice to the keeper of a vehicle from which litter is thrown, even if the identity of the person who threw the litter cannot be established.

This course provides an in-depth understanding of the civil procedure, to include the appeal and adjudication process, which must be adopted by any local authority looking to include this enforcement tool in its armoury to deal with litter and help improve environmental quality.
