## **SAFEGUARDING:**

Safeguarding is defined as: 'measures to protect the health, well-being and human rights of individuals, which allow people - especially children, young people and adults at risk - to live free from abuse, harm and neglect'.

## **UNDER 18s**

Keep Britain Tidy's policy states that any under 18s volunteering as part of your litter picking group <u>must</u> be accompanied by an adult who is a parent, guardian, registered carer, teacher, or DBS checked and safeguarding trained Youth Group leader (e.g. Scout/Guide/Cadets) <u>at all times</u>.
